La edición de partituras musicales es hoy prácticamente inexistente en nuestro país. De las buenas épocas editoriales nos queda sólo el recuerdo, ya que tampoco se reedita el material de otros tiempos.

Esta nueva colección de música para guitarra es fruto de una confluencia de voluntades que antepone el entusiasmo de crear a cualquier dificultad del momento. Hemos trabajado en conjunto sumando habilidades: los compositores y los intérpretes complementándose en una doble visión, buscando generar ediciones irreprochables en el cuidado de la relación exacta del signo impreso con el resultado sonoro. Así también los músicos junto a expertos en el arte del diseño, para obtener partituras de gran belleza visual.

El nivel creativo de estas obras está asegurado habida cuenta de la importancia de los autores que forman parte de la serie. Música contemporánea en la mejor acepción que esta palabra tiene, obras nuevas que no descreen de la tradición y aún así elementos académicos y populares sin proponérselo, como necesidad básica de un lenguaje que abarca lo mejor de todos los campos.

Sobre la "Danza de las manos":




Sobre "Rumor de tambores":


Composición en base a un ritmo rioplatense denominado "candombe".






